

**Notice of 2023 General Election and
Notice of Qualifying Period for 2023 General Election
by the Town of Clermont, Georgia**

The Town of Clermont, Georgia, will conduct a General Election on Tuesday, November 7, 2023, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., for the purpose of electing the following:

(A) The office of Town Councilmember of the Town of Clermont, Georgia, being Ward 1, which will be elected at large for a term of four (4) years beginning on or about January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2027, and with the incumbent being Amanda Nix.

(B) The office of Town Councilmember of the Town of Clermont, Georgia, being Ward 2, which will be elected at large for a term of four (4) years beginning on or about January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2027, with the incumbent being Doug Myers.

(C) The office of Town Councilmember of the Town of Clermont, Georgia, being at large, which will be elected at large for a term of four (4) years beginning on or about January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2027, with the incumbent being Seth Weaver.

The qualifying period, to qualify for the above offices, shall open on Monday, August 21, 2023 and will continue from day to day through Wednesday, August 23, 2023. The hours of qualifying each day shall be from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. (except for a one hour lunch break from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. each day).

The qualifying fee for each Council seat shall be \$43.20. Prospective candidates may qualify at the Town Hall, 109 King Street, Clermont, Georgia, by meeting with the Assistant Registrar and/or Town Clerk. Prospective candidates must reside within the Ward up for election to qualify. All qualified candidates are encouraged to run.

Advance voting for the election shall begin on Monday, October 16, 2023 and continue until Friday, November 3, 2023 and also Saturday voting will be conducted on the second and third Saturdays of October from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and with advance voting taking place at the Town Hall, 109 King Street, Clermont, Georgia 30527. Monday, October 16, 2023 is the first day to mail or issue official absentee ballots. No absentee by mail ballots will be available at the polling place; all absentee by mail voting will be conducted by the Hall County Elections office. Absentee by mail ballots will be issued, mailed, and received at the Hall County Elections office being the Hall County Government Center Office of Elections at 2875 Browns Bridge
